

Pun

A pun is a play on words that is often meant to be humorous. In poetry, we use puns for humor, particularly in poems like limericks, or we use them to give something double meaning to get the reader to think about an idea in a new way.

In this limerick, the author is playing with the word meter. The poem is meant to draw attention to the scansion in the last line (the line with the really bad timing).

Meter= something that measures gas consumption (in this poem)

Meter= the rhythm of a line of poetry

In this limerick, the author is playing with puns and alliteration to create a funny tongue-twister
